Liturgy

This Week's Readings ~ July 15, 2012

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Amos 7:12-15

Second Reading: Ephesians 1:3-14

Gospel: Mark 6:7-13

The Twelve are sent to towns of Galilee. It is a trial mission that looks ahead to the Christian mission to the world at large. All Christians are to speak for God in the world, even when the world does not care to listen. Jesus shares with the Twelve his powers over the forces of evil. Jesus says to get moving on this mission right away. The Twelve are to travel light. If they are offered hospitality, they should accept. If not, they are to shake the dust from their feet, which is what pious Jews did when they returned from unholy territory. Jesus did not tell the Twelve to preach about God's reign. That task belonged to Jesus. They were to be much like John the Baptizer preparing for Jesus' mission. They were happy with their success.

Describe a time in your life when you were genuinely lacking resources, but the task got done in spite of your poverty.

Share a time when you were able to let go to the disappointment of your failures and get on with your life.

How did you feel when called away on an emergency and you had to leave without any of the usual necessities?

Relate a time in your life when your attitude shifted from "no way, I can't do it." to "I certainly can." What caused the shift?

July 22, 2012 ~ 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Ezekiel 2:2-5

Psalm 123

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 12:7-10

Gospel: Mark 6:1-6

How easy it was to identify with Jesus and his disciples in today's Gospel. Like so many of us, especially in summertime, they were looking forward to time away from lives so busy they had no time to eat. But unlike the self-centered shepherds God condemns in today's first reading, Jesus taught the vast crowd "many things" (Mark 6:34) that day, perhaps the most important lesson was the one he taught his disciples not in words but in deeds, by giving up his time away—compassion for those in need.

We have water!

Howdy,

I arrived in the village on Monday afternoon and the drilling was in full-swing. They were still drilling in soil but soon hit rock and we saw gravel coming out. After a while I noticed the gravel get dark and sure enough it was wet. Then the water started spurting out of the drill hole. Everybody was very happy. It looks good. Tastes good too.

On Friday we'll get a read on how much volume per hour we can get. The water will be sent for testing but it's not salty so we can use it for irrigation at the very least and we can purify it if necessary so that the village can drink it too. God has certainly smiled upon us. Nobody expected to get this result so quickly, even the drilling team were surprised that we hit water on the first attempt and so early in the process.

I don't have internet in Bondo so this afternoon I drove to Kisumu to post video and update the Blog on the web site. (we can discuss driving in Kenya over a few beers - you have to keep your wits about you at all times) Check out the updates on the BLOG and on the VIDEO page at KenyaWell.COM (scroll to the bottom of the video page for latest).

We are having the Bridge Water Project team design a tank stand and quote us on building that and installing the tanks. This way we'll be able to pump the water up there and let gravity feed it out to nearby fields. The idea is to designate community crops that will be grown and sold to the Bondo University so that they can enrich the lives of the villagers. We are still a few \$ short of our goal (\$26k) to do the well + electric pump/solar panel set-up. We currently have around \$21k so please spread the word to your friends via social networks as it would be great to get everything done in the next couple of weeks.

Thanks so much for all that you have done to help this along. The villagers are so happy and thankful to your generosity. When I saw that water coming out it was the same feeling as being present when my children were born - pure joy.

One of the video interviews from March is with a lady called Rose and she was present on-site both days. I only got to talk with her briefly but she was over the moon and one of the first people to put her hand under the water spout so that she could taste it.

I'll post more when we have tested the pressure and start building the infrastructure.



Saint Camillus of Lellis
1550-1614
Feast Day: July 14

Camillus was a gambler. When he gambled for money, he nearly lost his life. When he gambled on God, he found his life.

Camillus, who was born in southern Italy, was the son of a professional soldier. Camillus trained to be a military man like his father. As a young man, he joined the army of Venice to fight the Turks. He was in rough company, and by the time Camillus was 25 years old, he was a reckless and compulsive gambler. Then a serious wound to his leg forced him to go to St. James Hospital in Rome.

There Camillus saw the sad condition of the patients. He wanted to help them, but he was dismissed from the hospital because he began to gamble again. Camillus tried to join a monastery, but he could not adjust to the lifestyle. Finally he returned to St. James Hospital in Rome.

For the rest of his life, Camillus gambled on God. Camillus became a priest and devoted himself to his priestly duties and to caring for the sick. Other young men in the hospital were inspired by his change of behavior. They joined him, and together they formed a religious order called the Servants of the Sick.

Camillus became a pioneer in setting up proper diets and providing fresh air for patients, and in separating those with contagious diseases. During the war in Hungary, he and his brother formed the first recorded military field ambulance corps. Right up until his death, Camillus worked hard for sick people—especially the poor. Today he is the patron saint of nurses and hospitals, and one of the patron saints of gamblers.
