Fr. Crispin: The Lord be with you.

All: **And with your spirit.**

Fr. Crispin: Lift up your hearts.

All: **We lift them up to the Lord.**

Fr. Crispin: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.

All: **It is right and just.**

Father Crispin continues the praying, then we all say together:

All: **Holy, holy, holy Lord**

**God of hosts,**

**Heaven and earth are full of your glory.**

**Hosanna in the highest.**

**Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.**

**Hosanna in the highest.**
